

Works update

Dear Members,

It's time to give you an update on the building works completed at the Mildmay Club over the last year and continuing into 2024/25. We have managed to achieve a lot this past year, thanks to our members' support, filming and hall hire income and our very capable team of contractors and consultants.

- Replacement of front and central roofs including reinstatement of our iconic Cupola
- New double-glazed timber windows to front
- Brick- and stonework refurbishment front elevation
- Tartan Bar refurbished, including fully functioning bar
- Replacement of all hot & cold water services, new booster tank and solar-electric hot water cylinders
- Expanded prep kitchen for catered events
- Accessible WC with nappy changing facility
- Ladies' and mens' WC refurbishment
- Cleaners' and utility room
- New manager's office
- New Club archive room
- Snooker hall side rooms refurbished
- Continued rolling programme of electrical and fire safety upgrade works

- Large hall roof replaced, including installation of solar PV panels and external wall repairs
- Replaced members bar roof
- Three new flats for rent on the second floor, works ongoing
- Refurbishment of our bars and ancillary areas

Our members' bar roof and gutters have been reconstructed to ensure that we manage rainwater flow and avoid flooding in future






Large hall roof

Works to our large hall roof are now complete and the first part of the scaffolding has been struck. We are now completing the final brickwork re-pointing and replacement of rainwater pipes. Our solar PV panels are up and running and generating energy for the Club, thanks to Stokey Energy and a generous grant from Hackney Council.









Flats

We are pleased with progress of the works to our flats on the top floor. They now have independent access from the street and new partition walls have been constructed and insulation fitted to floors and walls.

Health & Safety

Committee member Jon Riley is in charge of Health & Safety for the Club, working with Dill, Iona and Terri to ensure that our day-to-day operations run safely.

Jon's work includes

- ongoing monitoring of fire alarms, extinguishers and inspections, and signage
- managing our annual fire risk assessments, which are carried out by an external provider
- introducing formal training for staff members with professionals, including fire warden and fire drill training for staff and team leads and a full day first aid course for all staff, who are now accredited first aiders.
- removal of clutter and fire loading in storage areas, including continuing removal of 100 years worth of old wood and junk in the roof space above Tartan Bar. This uncovered a trove of valuable club archive which is being assessed.
- working with Iona, Terri and Andrea J to improve record keeping on accidents, fire floor plans, and training.
